### WORLD CIVILIZATIONS

#### HIS 1510

Credits: 3

Course Assistant: Sarah Nelson

**Description:** This course is an introductory course on selected topics in the history of major world civilizations that have shaped the foundations of mankind; from the earliest records of humankind through approximately 1500 AD. It is designed to familiarize students with the political, social, economic, religious, and intellectual histories of the world.

### COLLEGE ALGEBRA

#### MAT 131

Credits: 3

**Description:** This course provides a short review of Algebra II, followed by a concise study of algebraic, polynomial, exponential and logarithmic functions and their graphs. Linear, quadratic and systems of equations are included, along with their applications. This course provides a foundation for students wishing to take calculus.
